Chapter 85.

Снар. 85.

An act to incorporate the East Sangerville Cheese Factory Association.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. Daniel Spooner, Benjamin Lane, John Hill, Jr., E. G. Corporators. Flanders, F. D. Dearth and Leonard Dearth, their associates, successors and assigns, are hereby incorporated into a body politic and corporate by the name of the East Sangerville Cheese Factory Corporate name. Association, with all the powers and privileges, and subject to all the liabilities and duties incident to manufacturing corporations by the laws of the state.

Sect. 2. Said corporation is authorized and empowered to carry Business of corpoon the business of manufacturing cheese in the town of Sangerville, in the county of Piscataquis, and also to engage in such other branches of trade or manufactures as may be conveniently connected therewith, and may purchase and hold for such purposes real and personal estate to an amount not exceeding two personal estate. hundred and fifty thousand dollars.

Sect. 3. The shares of said company shall be of such number shares. as the directors may determine, the par value of the whole not to exceed two hundred and fifty thousand dollars.

Sect. 4. Daniel Spooner is hereby authorized to call the first First meeting. meeting of said corporation at Sangerville, by giving to each of the others a written notice of the same seven days before such meeting.

SECT. 5. This act shall take effect when approved.
