Chapter 96.CHAP. 96.

An act to incorporate the Deering Gas Light Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. Joseph S. Ricker, Horatio Q. Wheeler, James N. Winslow, William E. Gould, John B. Coyle, John B. Brown and Samuel Jordan, their associates and successors, are hereby constituted a body politic and corporate by the name of the Deering Gas Light Company, and by that name shall have and enjoy all the necessary powers and privileges to effect the objects of their association.

SECT. 2. The capital stock of said company shall be not less than twenty-five thousand dollars nor more than two hundred and fifty thousand dollars, and shall be divided into shares of one hundred dollars each.

SECT. 3. The object of the company shall be to manufacture and distribute gas for the purpose of lighting the town of Deering. The company are hereby authorized to lay down in and through the streets and roads of said town, and to take up, replace and repair all such pipes and fixtures as may be necessary for the objects of their incorporation, under such regulations as the town authorities may see fit to prescribe.

Authorized to lay pipes.

SECT. 4. The town of Deering is hereby authorized to contract with said company for lighting the roads and the public buildings of said town, and the necessary moneys to be expended therefor shall be assessed and collected in the same manner as taxes for other purposes.

Town of Deering authorized to contract with company for lighting streets.

SECT. 5. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 97.

An act to incorporate the Oriental Powder Mills.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. Joseph H. Newhall, Joshua M. C. Armsby, George M. Rice, Harrison Bliss, John W. Candler and Charles O. Foster, their associates, successors and assigns, are hereby created and constituted a body corporate and politic by the name of the Oriental Powder Mills, with all the powers and privileges and subject to all the duties and liabilities of manufacturing corporations.
