SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 111.

An act authorizing the city of Gardiner to raise money for the maintenance of a public library.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. The city of Gardiner is hereby authorized to appropriate and pay annually towards the expenses of maintaining and

CHAP. 112. increasing its public library, a sum not exceeding fifty cents for each of its ratable polls in the year next preceding that in which said appropriation is made.

Appropriation,

SECT. 2. No appropriation shall be made under and by virtue of this act, unless by the concurrent vote of three-fourths of the members of each branch of the city council.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 112.

An act additional to the charter of the Hollowell Academy.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Hollowell Academy transfer all property to Hollowell Classical and Scientific Academy.

SECT. 1. The trustees of the Hollowell Academy, in order more effectually to execute the trusts vested in them by their charter, are hereby authorized to transfer and convey to the trustees of the Hollowell Classical and Scientific Academy, the property, real, personal and mixed, funds, moneys and securities of every description, now held by them under their charter, to be held and used by said trustees of the Hollowell Classical and Scientific Academy perpetually, for the purposes and in execution of the trusts specified in said charter, and in no other way ; provided they shall maintain, permanently, the said Hollowell Classical and Scientific Academy in the city of Hollowell.

Property, when and how transferred.

SECT. 2. When said trustees, at a meeting regularly called and notified for the purpose according to their charter and by-laws, vote to transfer and convey their property as aforesaid, their treasurer shall, in behalf of said trustees, execute, acknowledge and deliver a deed of all their real estate and an assignment and transfer of all their personal property, moneys, funds and securities to the trustees of the Hollowell Classical and Scientific Academy.

If Classical and Scientific Academy fail in certain conditions, property to revert to city of Hollowell.

SECT. 3. If the trustees of the said Hollowell Classical and Scientific Academy shall fail or neglect to furnish to the inhabitants of Hollowell facilities for the education of scholars equal to and on the same or equal conditions to those now furnished by the Hollowell public high school, all the property thus transferred and conveyed by the trustees of the Hollowell Academy, shall revert to the city of Hollowell, to be used for the purposes specified in the original charter of the Hollowell Academy.

SECT. 4. This act shall take effect when approved.
