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**Chapter 117.****CHAP. 117.**

An act to incorporate the Bangor Manufacturing Company.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

SECT. 1. S. D. Thurston, Charles Hayward, Sidney Thaxter, E. A. Upton, James B. Fiske, J. B. Foster, A. D. Manson, Isaac M. Bragg, Thomas A. Taylor, J. S. Wheelwright and W. T. Pearson, their associates, successors and assigns, are hereby constituted a corporation by the name of the Bangor Manufacturing Company, with the powers and privileges and subject to the duties and requirements incident to manufacturing corporations.

Corporators.

Corporate name.

SECT. 2. The corporation is authorized to carry on, in the city of Bangor, the manufacture of cotton, wool, flax, iron, steel, paper, flour, lumber, leather, boots, shoes and moccasins, and other articles which may be lawfully manufactured and sold.

Authorized to manufacture cotton, wool, &c.

SECT. 3. Said corporation may acquire and hold by purchase or lease, real and personal estate to an amount not exceeding one million of dollars, may erect mills, and use for power water or steam, or both, and provide all the necessary machinery therefor, and may lease or sell to other persons or corporations room and power for manufacturing and mechanical purposes.

May purchase and hold real and personal estate.

May lease or sell room and power for manufacturing purposes.

SECT. 4. The first meeting of the corporation shall be called by either of the persons named in this act by publishing a notice in any newspaper in Bangor seven days before the meeting.

First meeting, how called.

SECT. 5. This act shall take effect when approved.

**Chapter 118.**

An act to make valid the doings of the village school district number fifteen, in the town of Pittsfield, and for other purposes.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

SECT. 1. All acts and proceedings of the inhabitants of the village school district number fifteen, in the town of Pittsfield, in the county of Somerset and State of Maine, in annual meetings assembled, in the years eighteen hundred seventy and seventy-one, in voting to raise and hire money to pay the indebtedness of said district, and the acts and proceedings of the assessors of said town of Pittsfield in assessing taxes upon the polls and estates in said district in the aforesaid years eighteen hundred seventy and seventy-one, and all acts and proceedings of G. A. Farwell as
