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CHAP. 161.**Chapter 161.**

An act to amend the charter of the Birch Stream Dam Company.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

Tolls prohibited unless dams are in good repair.

The Birch Stream Dam Company, incorporated by chapter five hundred and seventeen of the special laws of eighteen hundred and sixty-five, shall not be authorized to collect tolls on logs driven hereafter, unless its dams are in good repair.

**Chapter 162.**

An act to make valid the doings of the assessors of the town of Industry in committing taxes of the year eighteen hundred and sixty-nine to a constable.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

Assessors of Industry, certain acts of, made valid.

SECT. 1. The act of the assessors of the town of Industry in committing the taxes of eighteen hundred and sixty-nine to a constable for collection is hereby made valid.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

**Chapter 163.**

An act to authorize the trustees of the Methodist Episcopal Church in Newfield to dispose of the Methodist meeting-house therein.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

Authorized to sell house of worship.

SECT. 1. The trustees of the Methodist Episcopal Church of the town of Newfield, in the county of York, are hereby authorized and empowered to sell and dispose of their house of worship therein in such way and manner as they may deem most conducive to the interest of said church.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
