Chapter 4.

Resolve in favor of Salmore Francis.

Salmore Francis,
Indian repre-
sentative.

Resolved, That there be paid from the state treasury the sum of one hundred dollars, to Salmore Francis, for travel and attendance before the legislature as representative of the Passamaquoddy tribe of Indians.

Approved January 30, 1872.

Chapter 5.

Resolve in favor of Judge Maine.

Judge Maine for
ventilation.

Resolved, That the governor and council be directed to pay from the state treasury, from any money not otherwise appropriated, the sum of eighty-eight dollars, expended for the purpose of ventilation, by Judge Maine.

Approved February 2, 1872.

Chapter 6.

Resolve in favor of Oliver S. Dow and Thomas H. Randall.

Lot of land to be
conveyed to O. S.
Dow and T. H.
Randall.

Resolved, That the land agent be and he is hereby authorized to convey by deed, lot numbered fifty in Island Falls plantation, county of Aroostook, to Oliver S. Dow and Thomas H. Randall without the performance of further settling duties.
