Chapter 7.

CHAP. 7.

Resolve to amend a resolve of the year eighteen hundred and sixty-nine, entitled
 “Resolve authorizing the land agent to convey a lot of land in the town of Amity.”

Resolved, That the words “the east half of” and the words
 “the west half of said lot to the town of Amity for the support
 of,” be stricken out where they occur in chapter thirty-seven of
 the resolves of eighteen hundred and sixty-nine. Also substitute
 the words ‘twenty-two’ for the words “twenty-three” in said
 resolve, so that the same as amended shall read as follows :

Amendment.

Resolved, That the land agent be and he hereby is authorized to
 convey lot numbered twenty-two in the town of Amity to Thomas
 Catheleue and Almond Wilkins, when he shall become satisfied
 that the parties are equitably entitled to the same, and so much of
 said lot to be deeded to each as shall appear to equitably belong
 to each.

Chapter 8.

Resolves relative to the normal school at Castine.

Resolved, That the sum of twenty thousand dollars be and is
 hereby appropriated for the purchase or erection, furnishing and
 warming of a suitable school building for the eastern normal
 school, to be expended under the direction of the governor and
 council; *provided* the town of Castine shall furnish five thousand
 dollars in aid of the erection of said school building; which said
 sum of five thousand dollars said town is hereby authorized to
 assess and collect for that purpose, if this sum shall be necessary
 to complete and furnish the building and fence the grounds sur-
 rounding the same.

Resolved, That the resolve approved February twenty-fifth,
 eighteen hundred and seventy-one, appropriating fifteen thousand

Resolve in favor of Phebe W. Hayden.

Chapter 10.

Resolve in favor of David A. Sewell and Oliver S. Dow.

Island to be conveyed to D. A. Sewell and O. S. Dow.

Resolved, That the land agent be authorized and directed to convey by quit claim deed to David A. Sewell and Oliver S. Dow the island on which the dam of their mill rests, at Island falls, in the county of Aroostook.

Chapter 11.

Resolve in favor of Daniel Randall and Thomas H. Randall.

Lot of land to be sold to D. and T. H. Randall.

Resolved, That the land agent be and is hereby authorized to sell to Daniel Randall and Thomas H. Randall, lot numbered four in township numbered four, range four, west east line of the state, in the county of Aroostook, it being a swamp and meadow lot, at fifty cents per acre in road labor, waiving other settling duties.

Chapter 12.

Resolve in favor of Salmon Jones.

Lot of land, conveyance of, to S. Jones.

Resolved, That the land agent be instructed to convey by deed lot number thirteen in that part of Lyndon formerly Forestville plantation, in Aroostook county, to Salmon Jones, without requiring of said Jones any further settling duties.
