Chapter 40.**CHAP. 40.**

Resolve in relation to the state tax of certain towns and plantations in Aroostook county for the year eighteen hundred and seventy-one.

Resolved, That the state treasurer be required to abate so much of the state tax of the year eighteen hundred and seventy-one of the following towns and plantations in Aroostook county, namely: Grant Isle, Madawaska, Frenchville, Fort Kent, the plantations of Van Buren and Hamlin, Limestone, plantations number eleven range one, the plantations of Alva, Castle Hill, Mapleton, Woodland, Oakfield and Perham, as to make the state tax of said towns and plantations conform to their state valuation as established by a resolve of the legislature approved February twenty-seven, eighteen hundred and seventy-one.

Chapter 41.

Resolve in favor of Roscoe Ordway.

Resolved, That the land agent be authorized to convey to Roscoe Ordway the southwest part of the section of land numbered fifty-two in township numbered four, range five, in the county of Aroostook, containing two hundred twelve and forty-eight hundredths acres; *provided* said Ordway pay for the same in road labor and perform the settling duties as prescribed in section twenty-six of chapter five of the revised statutes, and that the land agent be authorized to issue a land certificate to said Ordway in the usual form.

Chapter 42.

Resolve in favor of Mrs. Beriah Brown of Benton.

Resolved, That the state treasurer is hereby authorized to pay to Mrs. Beriah Brown of Benton, in the county of Kennebec, the sum of ten dollars and fifty cents, being the amount due to her late husband, Beriah Brown, as state pensioner at the time of his decease.
