CHAP. 43.

Chapter 43.

Resolve in favor of the town of Columbia Falls.

Columbia Falls, errors in charges, authorized to be corrected.

Adjutant general to certify errors to governor and council.

Governor authorized to draw warrant.

Resolved, That the adjutant general is hereby directed by an examination of the pay rolls, receipts, records and all other papers pertaining to the subject, to ascertain if errors existed in the charges against the town of Columbia Falls for deficiencies of men under the call of October seventeenth, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, and ascertain if money was illegally and wrongfully demanded of said town and paid by them into the state treasury. And if he finds upon investigation that such errors did exist and money was illegally and wrongfully demanded and paid, he shall certify to the governor and council what amount of money is due said town by the state as reimbursement; and the governor is hereby authorized and instructed to draw his warrant for the amount specified by said certificate, and deliver it to the proper party.

Chapter 44.

Resolve in favor of Deodat Brastow in relation to certain lands in the town of Lincoln.

W. T. and H. Pierce and E. and J. Holyoke, title to land, land agent authorized to investigate.

Resolved, That the land agent is hereby authorized and directed to investigate the title to lands in the town of Lincoln, conveyed by Waldo T. and H. Pierce to Edward and John Holyoke by deed dated on the fifteenth day of April, in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and thirty-four, and recorded the same day in the registry of deeds for the county of Penobscot, being the same conveyed to said Waldo T. and H. Pierce by the deed dated on the fourth day of said April by John Hodgdon, then the land agent of the state; and that if he is satisfied upon such investigation that it would be prudent and expedient for the state to procure their release of the title of such parts of said lands as may have been conveyed by the state since said fifteenth day of April, in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and thirty-four, he is hereby authorized to negotiate for and obtain such release by conveying to them other lands belonging to the state of equal value.
