CHAP. 112.**Chapter 112.**

An act to provide for the enrolment of the militia.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Enrolment and
return of the
militia of the
state.

SECT. 1. It shall be the duty of the assessors of cities, towns and plantations of the state, to prepare lists of all persons who may be living within their respective limits and liable to enrolment; giving the name, age and occupation of each of such persons, and all facts which may determine his exemption from military duty, and place a certified copy of such lists in the hands of the clerk of their respective cities, towns or plantations, on or before the first day of June next, and the said clerks shall return copies of such lists to the adjutant general at Augusta, on or before the fifteenth day of June next.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 113.

An act relating to disturbing public meetings.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Meetings, penalty
for disturbing.

Whoever wilfully and unlawfully disturbs or interrupts any assembly of persons lawfully assembled in any hall or other place of meeting shall be punished by imprisonment not more than thirty days or by fine not exceeding ten dollars, or both, in the discretion of the court.

Chapter 114.

An act to amend section eighty-seven of chapter eleven of the revised statutes, relating to normal schools.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. Section eighty-seven of chapter eleven of the revised statutes is hereby amended so as to read as follows :

'SECT. 87. The normal schools established by the state shall be under the direction of a board of seven trustees, five of whom shall be appointed by the governor, by and with the advice and
