Chapter 117.

Снар. 117.

An act to provide for the appointment of an assistant county attorney for the county of Cumberland.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. The county attorney of the county of Cumberland is Assistant county hereby authorized to appoint an assistant, to be approved by the judge of the supreme court for said county. Said assistant shall authorized. take the same oath as that prescribed for county attorneys; shall -oath of office. assist the county attorney in the ordinary duties of his office, in -duties of. the drawing of indictments, and in the hearing of complaints before the grand jury, and the preparation and trial of criminal He shall, when directed by the county attorney, act as -shall act as counsel for the state in the trial of complaints, before judges of state when municipal courts and trial justices. The salary of said assistant shall be five hundred dollars, payable in the same manner as that -salary of of county attorney, and shall hold his office during the term of the -term of office. county attorney by whom he is appointed, but may be removed at any time by the court.

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 118.

An act to amend chapter thirty-eight of the public laws of eighteen hundred and seventytwo, relating to insolvent estates.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Chapter thirty-eight of the public laws of eighteen hundred and seventy-two is hereby amended by striking out the second section of said chapter.

Chapter 119.

An act to define what shall constitute pauper supplies.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Sect. 1. That to constitute pauper supplies, under the laws of Pauper supplies, how constituted. this state, such supplies shall be applied for in case of all adult persons of sound mind, by such persons themselves, or by some
