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**CHAP. 202.** shall be sold by the directors for the account of the corporation; and no share shall be issued until payment for the same is made in cash.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

### Chapter 202.

An act to repeal chapter seven hundred and fifteen of the private and special laws of eighteen hundred and seventy-one, relating to the duties of the constable of the town of Whitefield.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Constables of Whitefield, act granting certain powers to, repealed.

SECT. 1. Chapter seven hundred and fifteen of the private and special laws of eighteen hundred and seventy-one, entitled "an act relating to the powers and duties of constables of the town of Whitefield," be and the same is hereby repealed; but this repeal shall not affect any actions or processes now pending, or any services already made by any constable of said town.

Proviso.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

### Chapter 203.

An act to incorporate the Portland Fire Insurance Company.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Corporators.

SECT. 1. John B. Brown, William W. Thomas, Samuel E. Spring, Harrison J. Libby, Edward Fox, George F. Shepley, Israel Washburn, Jr., Charles P. Kimball, Samuel J. Anderson, T. C. Hersey, J. S. Winslow, Charles Fobes, A. K. Shurtleff, Woodbury S. Dana, J. W. Perkins, G. C. Tyler, J. S. Bedlow, M. N. Rich, Josiah H. Drummond, Francis Fessenden, George E. B. Jackson, William L. Putnam, H. N. Jose, with their associates and successors be and they hereby are made a body corporate and politic by the name of the Portland Fire Insurance Company, and may exercise all the powers and privileges which are now held by similar companies incorporated in this state, and may make insurance against losses by fire, and may make such by-laws as they may deem advisable not inconsistent with the laws of this state in relation to stock insurance companies.

Corporate name.

Powers and privileges.

SECT. 2. The capital stock of this company shall be one hundred thousand dollars, with liberty to increase the same to a sum not exceeding five hundred thousand dollars, and shall be divided into shares of one hundred dollars each, one-fourth of which shall be actually paid in before any risk shall be taken, and the other three-fourths parts in six, twelve and eighteen months after the payment of the first fourth part of said capital stock; or if the business of the company shall in the judgment of the directors require the entire payment of or any additional part of said capital stock, then the same shall be paid in at such earlier time or times as said directors shall determine, after due notice shall be given by publication in some newspaper printed in Portland three weeks successively, the first publication to be at least thirty days before the time of payment.

## CHAP. 204.

SECT. 3. The business of this company shall be managed by a board consisting of not less than seven nor more than fifteen directors, with such other officers as said directors may elect. Four directors shall constitute a quorum for doing business. Any director or officer of other insurance companies shall be eligible as director or officer of this company.

## Chapter 204.

An act to incorporate the town of Kingman.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECT. 1. McCrillis plantation, bounded on the north by the county line, on the east by Number Seven, range four, on the south by Webster plantation, and on the west by Mattawamkeag plantation, in the county of Aroostook, is hereby incorporated into a town by the name of Kingman; and the inhabitants of said town are hereby invested with all the powers, privileges, immunities and liabilities of other towns.

SECT. 2. Any justice of the peace within the county of Aroostook is hereby empowered to issue his warrant to some inhabitant of said town, directing him to notify the inhabitants thereof to meet at such time and place as he shall appoint, to choose such officers as other towns are empowered to choose.

SECT. 3. The town hereby created shall take the effects belonging to McCrillis plantation, and shall also assume all the obligations thereof.

—shall take effects and assume debts of McCrillis plantation.

SECT. 4. This act shall take effect when approved.
