CHAP. 205.

Chapter 205.

An act authorizing B. Brastow and others to extend a wharf or wharves into the tide waters of the Penobscot river.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Authorized to
extend wharf.

Location.

Limit.

SECT. 1. Braser Brastow, F. H. Brastow and G. C. Brastow, their heirs and assigns, are hereby authorized to extend a wharf or wharves from their land and dock in Orrington into the tide waters of the Penobscot river, not exceeding sixty feet from low water mark.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 206.

An act to authorize A. Judson Ray and Charles W. Ray to build a dyke across Coles' creek, in the town of Harrington.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Authorized to
build dyke.

Location of.

By-laws.

Expenses, how
paid.

SECT. 1. A. Judson Ray and Charles W. Ray, their associates, successors, heirs and assigns, are hereby authorized to build and maintain a good and sufficient dyke across Coles' creek, so called, in the town of Harrington, in the county of Washington, at or near where they now have one built, near the premises of Charles W. Ray.

SECT. 2. The persons named in section one may make such by-laws, not repugnant to the laws of the state, as may be necessary to carry out the objects of this act.

SECT. 3. All persons whose land is benefited by said dyke shall pay their proportional part, according to the number of acres receiving such benefit.

SECT. 4. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 207.

An act to authorize Willard P. Harriman to extend a wharf into tide water, in the city of Belfast.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Authorized to
build a wharf.

SECT. 1. Willard P. Harriman, his heirs, associates, successors or assigns, are hereby authorized to build and extend a wharf

into tide water, in the city of Belfast, and to maintain the same, CHAP. 208.
 abreast of his land which extends from land of late S. S. Lewis to Location of.
 land of Daniel Haraden, and to extend the same as far as a line
 from the outer end of said Lewis' wharf, running in a straight line
 to the outer end of said Haraden's wharf, and no farther.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 208.

An act to prevent the taking of trout in Bellscoep Meadow brook, in the town of Waldo-
 borough.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legis-
 lature assembled, as follows :*

SECT. 1. No person shall be allowed to catch or take any trout Taking of trout
prohibited.
 from Bellscoep Meadow brook, so called, in the town of Waldo-
 borough, in Lincoln county, for the term of five years, under a
 penalty of five dollars for each trout so taken, to be recovered in —penalty for,
how recovered
and disposed of.
 an action of debt, one-half to go to the prosecutor and one-half
 to said town of Waldoborough.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 209.

An act to incorporate and prescribe the duties and powers of the Maine Poultry
 Association.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legis-
 lature assembled, as follows :*

SECT. 1. Fred Atwood, Albert Noyes, J. W. Lang, B. F. Corporators.
 Hamilton, George E. Stockwell, Allen Carter, Seward Dill, Ezra
 Manter, S. L. Boardman, Fred Sawyer, Rufus Prince, D. M.
 Dunham, Walter Haley, John F. Libby, J. W. Eveleth, and Wil-
 liam Swett, their associates successors and assigns, be and are
 hereby created a corporation by the name of the Maine Poultry Corporate name.
 Association, with power by that name to sue and be sued, use a Powers and
privileges.
 common seal, make a constitution and by-laws for the manage-
 ment of their affairs, and to hold and exercise all the powers and
 privileges incident to similar corporations.
