**Chapter 211.**

CHAP. 211.

An act to incorporate the Union Hall Company of Southport.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

SECT. 1. Simeon Pool, William F. Maddocks, Cyrus Pierce, James H. Rand, Joseph Maddocks and Ephraim Pinkham, their associates, successors and assigns, are hereby constituted a body politic and corporate by the name of the Union Hall Company of Southport, and by that name may prosecute and defend suits at law and in equity, may have and use a common seal, and establish such by-laws, rules and regulations as are necessary for the convenient management of their affairs and not repugnant to the laws of this state. Said corporation is created for the purpose of maintaining, in the town of Southport, a hall for social and literary purposes.

SECT. 2. Said corporation is hereby authorized to raise money by assessment by a vote of a majority of the members present at any meeting duly called at which a quorum shall be present ; to hold property, real and personal, to the amount of two thousand dollars, and to do all other acts properly pertaining to the objects of this association.

Money, how raised

May hold real and personal estate.

SECT. 3. Any three corporators herein named are authorized to call the first meeting of said corporation, by posting notice in three public places in said town at least seven days before the time appointed for said meeting.

First meeting, how called.

SECT. 4. This act shall take effect when approved.

**Chapter 212.**

An act to authorize the county commissioners of Penobscot county to re-assess certain taxes.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

SECT. 1. That the county commissioners of Penobscot county be and hereby are authorized to assess the county tax on wild lands in said county, for the year eighteen hundred and seventy-two, which assessment shall be in lieu of the former assessment made, and shall be valid, as if no other assessment had been made.

County commissioners authorized to re-assess tax for '72 on wild lands.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
