SECT. 3. Said corporation may divide their original stock into such number of shares, and provide for the sale and transfer thereof in such manner and form as said corporators shall from time to time determine, not repugnant to the laws of this state. Shares.

SECT. 4. The office of said company shall be at Bangor in the county of Penobscot, or at Brownville, Piscataquis county, and there all books of record and transfer shall be kept, the secretary of said company shall reside at Bangor or Brownville, and a majority of the directors shall reside in this state. Office of company, where located.

SECT. 5. This act shall take effect when approved.

### Chapter 217.

An act to provide in part for the expenditures of government.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

SECT. 1. In order to provide for the several acts and resolves of the legislature requiring the payment of money from the treasury, and also to provide for the necessary expenditures of government for the current fiscal year, the following sums are hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the treasury, and the governor with the advice and consent of the council, is hereby authorized at any time prior to the first day of January next, to draw his warrant upon the treasury for the same. **Chapter 218.**

An act authorizing the filling of a channel between Deer Isle and Little Deer Isle.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

SECT. 1. The town of Deer Isle in the county of Hancock, shall be and hereby is authorized and empowered to fill up the channel that crosses the bar over which the highway leading from said Deer Isle to Little Deer Isle passes, said channel not to be filled higher than other parts of the bar.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

**Chapter 219.**

An act to remove gates and bars from the highways in North Haven.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

SECT. 1. All highways and public ways in the town of North Haven in the county of Knox, shall hereafter be open and unobstructed at all seasons of the year and that all gates, bars or any other hindrances to travel be removed.

Highways in North Haven shall be unobstructed.

SECT. 2. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent with this act are hereby repealed.

Inconsistent acts repealed.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.
