CHAP. 236.

Chapter 236.

An act to incorporate the town of Benedicta.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Town of Benedicta, to incorporate.

SECT. 1. Benedicta plantation, composed of the west half of township numbered two, range five, in the county of Aroostook, is hereby incorporated into a town by the name of Benedicta, and the inhabitants of said town are hereby invested with all the powers, privileges, immunities and liabilities of other towns.

Town meeting to choose officers, how called.

SECT. 2. Any justice of the peace within the county of Aroostook is hereby empowered to issue his warrant to some inhabitant of said town, directing him to notify the inhabitants thereof to meet at such time and place as he shall appoint to choose such officers as other towns are empowered to choose.

Town to take effects and assume liabilities of the plantation.

SECT. 3. The town hereby created shall take the effects belonging to Benedicta and shall also assume all the liabilities thereof.

SECT. 4. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 237.

An act to incorporate the Trustees of the Abbott Family School at Little Blue.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Corporators.

SECT. 1. Alexander H. Abbott, Samuel Belcher, Charles C. Rounds, and S. Clifford Belcher, their associates and successors, are hereby incorporated a body politic by the name of the Trustees of the Abbott Family School at Little Blue, for the promotion of literature, science and morality.

Corporate name and purpose of.

Rights and privileges.

SECT. 2. Said corporation is hereby vested with all the rights, privileges and immunities incident to similar corporations; may use a common seal, prosecute and defend suits at law, make and establish by-laws and regulations for the management of its affairs and the well ordering of said school not repugnant to the laws of the state, and hold estate real and personal that it may hereafter receive by gift, grant, or otherwise, the yearly net income of which shall not exceed the sum of five thousand dollars.

By laws.

May hold real and personal estate.

First meeting, how called.

SECT. 3. Alexander H. Abbott is hereby authorized to call the first meeting of said corporation, by posting up notices in two or more public places in Farmington Centre village ten days at least before the meeting of said corporation.

SECT. 4. This act shall take effect when approved.
