PRIVATE AND SPECIAL LAWS

OF THE

SECT. 4. Any two persons named in this act may call the first meeting by notice in some newspaper published in Franklin county, seven days at least before the meeting.

Chapter 245.

An act to incorporate the Penobscot Brick Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. I. V. Grindal, E. R. Bowden, B. H. Cushman, A. M. Grindle, James Grendell, F. A. Grendell, J. H. Littlefield, O. S. Wight, M. Wardwell, Francis Grindell, C. J. Hall and Henry Flitner, their associates, successors and assigns, are hereby incorporated a body politic and corporate by the name of the Penobscot Brick Company, with all the powers and privileges, and subject to all the liabilities and duties incident to manufacturing corporations in this state.

SECT. 2. Said corporation is authorized and empowered to carry on the business of brick making in the town of Penobscot, in the county of Hancock, and also to engage in such branches of manufacture as may be necessary or convenient in connection with such business, and may purchase and hold for such purposes real and personal estate to an amount not exceeding ten thousand dollars.

SECT. 3. The shares of said company shall be of such number as the directors may determine, the par value of the whole number not to exceed the aggregate sum of ten thousand dollars.

SECT. 4. Any one of the corporators is hereby authorized to call the first meeting of the company, at Penobscot, Maine, by giving to each of the others a written notice of the same seven days before such meeting.
