CHAP. 265.

Chapter 265.

An act to authorize the Clark's Island Granite Company to build and maintain a causeway from said island to the main land.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Authorized to
build a causeway.

The Clark's Island Granite Company, their associates and assigns, are hereby authorized to build and maintain from Clark's island, in the town of Saint George, to the main land, a causeway suitable for the passage of teams at all times of tide ; said causeway to terminate at the highway leading to said island, and to have a bridged space at least twenty feet wide and of sufficient height for the passage of boats at high water.

Chapter 266.

An act to incorporate the Odd Fellows Hall Association.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Corporators.

SECT. 1. Franklin Fox, Joseph K. Merrill, Orin B. Whitten, Albro E. Chase, Charles H. Rich, Joshua Davis and Stephen K. Dyer, their associates, successors and assigns are hereby constituted a body politic and corporate by the name of the Odd Fellows

Corporate name.

Purpose of.

Powers, privileges and liabilities.

Hall Association for the purpose of providing and maintaining a building in the city of Portland, suitable for a place of meeting of the various orders of Odd Fellows in that city and for other lawful purposes, with all the powers and privileges, and subject to all the duties and liabilities provided by the general laws of the state.

Capital stock.

Shares.

SECT. 2. The capital stock of said corporation shall not exceed one hundred and fifty thousand dollars ; the corporation being hereby authorized to fix the number of shares of said capital stock and the par value thereof.

May hold real and personal property.

SECT. 3. Said corporation is hereby authorized to hold real and personal property to an amount not exceeding two hundred thousand dollars.

First meeting, how called.

SECT. 4. Any one of the corporators above mentioned may call the first meeting of said corporation for the purpose of organization by giving written notice thereof to each corporator or by publishing notice in some newspaper printed in Portland, at least seven days before the time appointed for said meeting.

SECT. 5. This act shall take effect when approved.
