CHAP. 272.**Chapter 272.**

An act to incorporate the Pondicherry Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Corporators.	SECT. 1. William F. Perry, George Taylor, William H. Milliken, Joseph E. Blabon, Rufus Gibbs, Charles E. Gibbs, Owen B. Gibbs, are hereby incorporated as a manufacturing corporation,
Corporate name.	under the style of Pondicherry Company, to be located at Portland, Cumberland county, with authority to manufacture any
Purpose.	products of wool or cotton, at Bridgton, in said county, and to
Capital stock and shares.	hold all real or personal property proper therefor, with a capital not exceeding one hundred fifty thousand dollars, in shares of one hundred dollars each, subject to all the general laws of the state relative to manufacturing corporations.
First meeting, how called.	SECT. 2. The first meeting of said corporation shall be called at Portland, by any two corporators, by giving the other corporators two days' written notice of the time and place of meeting.
	SECT. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 273.

An act to incorporate the Franklin Land and Lumber Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Corporators.	SECT. 1. Howard Snelling, George H. Smith, Nathaniel E. Cutler and Isaac W. Bradbury, with their associates and successors, are hereby constituted a body politic and corporate, by the name
Corporate name.	of the Franklin Land and Lumber Company, with all the powers and privileges and subject to all the duties and liabilities of manufacturing corporations as defined by the general laws of this state.
Powers, privileges and liabilities.	
Purpose.	SECT. 2. The said company may, on the Carrabassett river and on the Kennebec river, at and below Anson, erect mills, maintain side booms not interfering thereby with navigation or any rights heretofore granted, and carry on in all its branches the cutting, driving and manufacture of lumber, and to that end they
May hold real and personal property.	are authorized to purchase and hold lands and other property in Franklin and Somerset counties in this state, and to remove rocks, trees and other natural obstructions from the bed of the Carrabassett river.
Capital stock.	SECT. 3. The said Franklin Land and Lumber Company may have and maintain a capital stock not to exceed five hundred

thousand dollars, to be divided into shares of one hundred dollars each, the number of which may be determined and fixed by the directors of said company from time to time at meetings called for that purpose; and said capital stock may be invested in real and personal property in such proportions as the directors of said company may determine.

CHAP. 274.

Shares.

SECT. 4. The said Franklin Land and Lumber Company may, upon being authorized by a majority of the votes at a meeting of its stockholders, called for the purpose, issue bonds in sums of not less than five hundred dollars each, payable at periods not exceeding ten years from the date thereof, and bearing interest not exceeding eight per centum a year, payable annually or semi-annually, to an amount not exceeding sixty thousand dollars, and may mortgage its property, real and personal, to secure the payment of any bonds so issued and interest thereon.

SECT. 5. The said company shall keep at some place in Somerset or Kennebec counties, in this state, a clerk's office containing their records and books, for the inspection of persons interested.

Chapter 274.

An act to authorize Eli Bickmore and Zenas Cook to maintain and extend their wharf into tidewater of Friendship harbor.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. Eli Bickmore, Zenas Cook, their heirs and assigns, are hereby authorized and empowered to maintain, build and extend a wharf on their land in Friendship harbor, and extend the same two hundred feet into tidewater of Friendship harbor, in the town of Friendship, county of Knox; *provided however*, that the location of said wharf shall not jeopardize in any manner the rights and privileges of the citizens of said harbor, nor obstruct the navigation of the said harbor.

Proviso.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
