under such limitations and restrictions, and with such provisions CHAP. 283. for the return of the unexpended balance of premiums that may remain at the expiration of each policy issued, after the payment of all losses and expenses, as the company may prescribe; which terms and conditions, limitations and restrictions, and provisions for a return premium, shall be inserted in, or shall be attached to each policy issued.

SECT. 6. No policy of insurance shall be issued by said company, until applications shall have been made for insurance to the amount of thirty thousand dollars.

SECT. 7. The first meeting of said corporation may be called First meeting, by either of the two persons first above named, by notice in writing of the time and place of meeting, to each one of said corporators, seven days at least, before the time named for such meeting.

Sect. 8. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 283.

An act to amend "an act to incorporate the town of Kingman," approved January twenty-five, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. Section one of said act is hereby amended in the fourth line, by striking out "Aroostook" and inserting 'Penobscot,' so that said section as amended shall read:

'SECT. 1. McCrillis plantation, bounded on the north by the Town of Kingcounty line, on the east by number seven, range four, on the south porate. by Webster plantation, and on the west by Mattawamkeag plantation, in the county of Penobscot, is hereby incorporated into a town by the name of Kingman, and the inhabitants of said town are hereby invested with all the powers, privileges, immunities and liabilities of other towns.'

And section two of said act is amended in the second line as follows: by striking out the word "Aroostook" and inserting 'Penobscot,' so that said section, as amended, shall read:

'SECT. 2. Any justice of the peace within the county of First meeting, Penobscot is hereby empowered to issue his warrant to some inhabitant of said town, directing him to notify the inhabitants thereof to meet at such time and place as he shall appoint, to choose such officers as other towns are empowered to choose.'

This act shall take effect when approved.
