in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and seventy-two, are hereby made valid and as effectual to all intents and purposes as if the said Jared C. Nash had been in commission as a justice of the peace when said acts and doings were performed by him.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 290.

An act relative to the Androscoggin Pulp Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. The Androscoggin Pulp Company is authorized to increase its capital stock to an amount not exceeding one hundred thousand dollars.

Capital stock increased.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 291.

An act to prevent the casting of sawdust, edgings, trimmings, and brush, into Mill Brook, in the town of Waterford.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. It shall be unlawful for any owner of mills or meadows on the stream of water flowing from Thomas pond to Bear pond, in the town of Waterford and county of Oxford, known by the name of Mill Brook, or any person or persons employed in or about said mills or otherwise, to cast any edgings, trimmings or shavings of boards, laths, shingles or other lumber, sawdust, bark and grindings, or brush, wood or stumps, into the waters of said stream, or allow the same to be deposited in such a manner that it may be washed therein.

Throwing obstructions into Mill Brook prohibited.

SECT. 2. If any person or persons shall violate the provisions of section one of this act, he or they shall be subject to a fine or penalty of not more than fifty or less than ten dollars, upon complaint and conviction before any court of competent jurisdiction.

Penalty for violation.

SECT. 3. Any person who may suffer damage to his lands, mill pond or mill privilege, by reason of the violation of the provisions

Damages and how recovered.

CHAP. 292. of section one of this act, may recover for said damages by an action on the case, of the persons so violating said section and causing such damage.

SECT. 4. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 292.

An act to authorize Josiah H. P. Merrow, Norris W. Purrinton and their associates to extend a wharf at Bowdoinham.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Authorized to
build a wharf.

SECT. 1. Josiah H. P. Merrow, Norris W. Purrinton, their associates and assigns, are hereby authorized to extend a wharf from their shore, at their brick yard, into the tide waters of Cathance river, to the eastern bank of the channel of said river below low water mark.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 293.

An act to make legal the doings of the Union Meeting House Association of Round Pond, in the town of Bristol.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Certain acts
made valid.

SECT. 1. The doings of the Union Meeting House Association of Round Pond, in the town of Bristol, at its meeting on the fourteenth day of October, eighteen hundred and sixty-nine, and at all its meetings subsequent thereto, are hereby ratified and made legal and valid.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
