Chapter 334.

An act to amend section one of chapter five hundred and forty-six of the private and special laws of eighteen hundred and fifty-two, relating to the Morcantile Library Association of Portland.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section one of chapter five hundred and forty-six of the private sec. 1, chap. 546, and special laws of eighteen hundred and fifty-two is amended by amended. striking out the word "fifty" and substituting therefor the words 'one hundred,' so that said act, when amended, shall read as follows:

'SECT. 1. The Mercantile Library Association of Portland, a Corporate name. voluntary association now existing in the city of Portland, for the purpose of promoting and diffusing knowledge among young men Purpose. now engaged in, or destined for, the mercantile profession, is hereby created a body politic and corporate by the same name, and with power to take by purchase, bequest or otherwise, and to hold, transfer and convey real and personal property to the Mayhold real and amount of one hundred thousand dollars, the legal title of which shall be in five trustees, but subject to the care and management Title of property and disposal thereof to the control and direction of a joint board of directors, for the time being, which board of directors shall not consist of more than eleven members.'

Chapter 335.

An act to authorize James Roberts and others to extend their wharf into tide waters in the town of Vinalhaven.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Sect. 1. James Roberts, E. L. Roberts, James L. Smith, Simon Authorized to G. Webster, their heirs, associates and assigns, are hereby

authorized to extend and maintain their wharf into tide waters of Carvers harbor, in the town of Vinalhaven, a distance of seventyfive feet beyond its present limits.

Chapter 336.

An act to extend the time for locating, building and completing the Portland and Ogdensburg Railroad.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Location, time of, extended.

Sect. 1. The time for locating, building and completing the Portland and Ogdensburg Railroad is hereby extended to the thirty-first day of December, eighteen hundred and seventy-five.

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 337.

An act to authorize the extension of the charter of the Androscoggin Navigation Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Right to navigate Androscoggin river, time extended SECT. 1. That the act of incorporation granted John Hearsey, Cornelius Holland, Hiram Ricker, Alvin Bolster, Calvin S. Brown, and such other persons as may hereafter associate with them, and their successors, the right to navigate the Androscoggin river between Canton point and Rumford falls, approved March twentyninth, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-three, entitled "an act to incorporate the Androscoggin Navigation Company," shall continue and remain in force until the first day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, with all the rights and privileges and all the responsibilities acquired under said act.
