PRIVATE AND SPECIAL LAWS

OF THE

STATE OF MAINE.

Chapter 338.

An act to incorporate the State Publishing Association.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. M. V. B. Stimson, J. H. Burleigh, James M. Stone, George W. Bicknell, Oliver Moses, B. C. Bailey and H. J. Bradbury, their associates, successors and assigns, are constituted and made a body corporate and politic by the name of the State Publishing Association, with power under that name to sue and be sued, to have a common seal and to alter the same, and with all the privileges and obligations of like corporate bodies under the laws of the state.

Corporators.

Corporate name.

Rights and privileges.

SECT. 2. Said corporation may have a capital stock of fifty thousand dollars, to be divided into shares of such amount as a majority of the corporators may determine.

Capital stock and shares.

SECT. 3. Said corporation is authorized to carry on the business of printing and publishing in all its legitimate branches in the city of Portland.

Purpose.

SECT. 4. Said corporation is hereby authorized to purchase, lease and hold such real and personal estate as it may seem necessary for a proper transaction of its business and to sell, lease, convey and mortgage the same; and may adopt a code of by-laws not inconsistent with the laws of the state.

Authorized to hold real and personal estate.

SECT. 5. Any two persons herein named are authorized to call the first meeting of said corporation, by serving seven days' written notice on each of the other corporators.

First meeting, how called.

SECT. 6. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 339.

An act to incorporate the Star Slate Company of Monson.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. Aretas Chapin, S. A. Patten, Charles Davison, W. G. Jones, David R. Straw, Jr., their associates, successors and assigns, are hereby created a body politic and corporate by the name of the Star Slate Company of Monson, for the purpose of quarrying and manufacturing slate in its various forms and for any other purpose necessary therefor, with all the powers and privileges and subject to all the duties, liabilities and requirements of similar corporations by the laws of the state.

CHAP. 340.

May hold real
and personal
estate.

SECT. 2. Said corporation may purchase and hold real and personal estate to an amount not exceeding at any one time two hundred and fifty thousand dollars, with full powers to manage and dispose of the same.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 340.

An act to authorize Alfred E. Conners and others to extend a wharf into the tide waters of Frenchman's bay.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Authorized to
extend wharf.

SECT. 1. Alfred E. Conners, Jacob Laminsby and Frank M. Conners are hereby authorized jointly to extend a wharf into the tide waters of Frenchman's bay, a distance not exceeding thirty feet.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 341.

An act to authorize the inhabitants of the town of Oxford to raise money for a public library.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Authorized to
raise money for a
public library.

SECT. 1. The inhabitants of the town of Oxford in the county of Oxford are hereby authorized at any legal meeting of the same to raise a sum of money, not exceeding three hundred dollars, in addition to the sum already raised, and assess the same on the polls and estate of said inhabitants, at such time as said inhabitants shall vote to establish and maintain a public library for the use of the inhabitants of said town, under such rules and regulations for its government as said inhabitants shall from time to time prescribe.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
