CHAP. 350.

May hold real and personal estate.

Deeds, how executed.

dollars each. They may purchase, hold, lease and sell, such real and personal estate as may seem necessary, to erect and maintain a hotel in the city of Belfast, and furnish and conduct the same, and all deeds of conveyance, leases, covenants and grants, made by said corporation shall be signed by the president and treasurer, and acknowledged by either of them.

Officers and term

Sect. 3. Said corporation may choose a president, secretary, treasurer, superintendent, directors and other officers, who may continue in office one year, and until others are elected and qualified. The first meeting of the association may be called by either of the two persons first above named, by notice in writing, of the time and place of meeting to each one of the corporators, five days at least before the time named for such meeting.

First meeting, how called.

Exempt from taxation.

SECT. 4. The inhabitants of the city of Belfast, at any meeting regularly called for the purpose, have authority, by a majority of two-thirds of those voting, to exempt from taxation for the term of ten years, then next ensuing, any or all of the real and personal estate owned by said corporation.

Sect. 5. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 350.

An act to incorporate the Cove Slate Company in the town of Monson.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Corporators.

Corporate name.

Purpose.

Powers and liabilities.

Waste, how disposed of.

May hold real and personal estate. Sect. 1. Charles Davison, S. A. Patten, their successors and assigns, are hereby created a body politic and corporate by the name of the Cove Slate Company, for the purpose of quarrying and manufacturing slate in its various forms and for any other purpose necessary therefor, with all the powers and privileges and subject to all the duties, liabilities and requirements of similar corporations by the laws of the state.

SECT. 2. Said corporation may have the right to dump the waste from their quarry to Hebron pond, and deposit it therein; may purchase and hold real and personal estate to an amount not exceeding, at any one time, two hundred and twenty-five thousand dollars, with full powers to manage and dispose of the same.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.
