#### Chapter 365.

Снар. 365.

An act authorizing Jeremiah P. Simpson and William G. Mathews to extend their wharf into the tide waters of York river.

Be'it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Sect. 1. Jeremiah P. Simpson and William G. Mathews, all of Authorized to build a wharf. York, in the county of York, their heirs and assigns, are hereby authorized and empowered to rebuild, extend and maintain their -limit of. wharf in said York, into the tide waters of York river, a distance of eighty feet, and seventy feet wide at the outer front.

This act shall take effect when approved.

#### Chapter 366.

An act authorizing the town of Yarmouth to loan its credit for the establishment of manufactures.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. The town of Yarmouth, in the county of Cumberland, Town authorized in order to promote the interest and welfare of its citizens, is hereby authorized and empowered in its corporate capacity, by a vote of at least two-thirds of the legal voters therein present and voting at any legal meeting thereof called for that purpose, to loan its credit for a sum not exceeding two and one-half per cent. of its last state valuation, for the purpose of aiding in the establishment or maintenance of manufactures therein, upon such terms and conditions in all respects as shall be imposed by such vote.

SECT. 2. Said town of Yarmouth, for the purpose specified in -authorized to issue scrip. section one, is hereby authorized and empowered to issue and deliver to any person or persons from time to time, the scrip of the town, not exceeding the amount authorized by this act, in certificates of not less than one hundred dollars each, payable to Scrip certificates the holders thereof at such time as the town may prescribe, with coupons attached for interest at a rate not exceeding seven per cent. per annum, payable semi-annually. Said scrip shall be signed by the treasurer and countersigned by one of the select- -how signed. men; but the coupons shall be signed by the treasurer only.

SECT. 3. Said town at its annual town meeting in any year is -how paid. hereby authorized to raise such sum of money for the payment of said scrip and coupons as may be deemed advisable, and such money so raised shall be assessed upon the polls and estates
