Chapter 399.**CHAP. 399.**

An act to incorporate the Frontier Fish, Oil, and Fertilizing Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. Upham S. Treat, Samuel D. Leavitt, and A. N. Staples of Eastport, their associates and successors, are hereby incorporated and made a body politic, by the name of the Frontier Fish, Oil, and Fertilizing Company, for the purpose of putting up cunny, fish and oil, and manufacturing a fertilizer from fish and oil ; said corporators to have the right to select fellow corporators as they may choose at their first meeting.

Corporators.

Corporate name.

Purpose.

SECT. 2. Said corporation may hold real and personal estate to the amount of two hundred thousand dollars in value, and shall have all the powers and privileges, and be subject to all the duties and liabilities of similar corporations, as defined by the laws of this state.

May hold real and personal estate.

Powers, privileges and liabilities.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 400.

An act to provide in part for the expenditures of government.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. In order to provide for the several acts and resolves of the legislature requiring the payment of money from the treasury, and also to provide for the necessary expenditures of government for the current fiscal year, the following sums are hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the treasury, and the governor with the advice and consent of the council is hereby authorized at any time prior to the first day of January next to draw his warrant upon the treasury for the same :

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 401.

An act relating to "an act amendatory of the charter of the city of Lewiston."

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Act changed from
public to private.

SECT. 1. That section one of "an act amendatory of an act to incorporate the city of Lewiston," approved February twenty-seventh, eighteen hundred and seventy-three, and the title of said act, are hereby amended by striking out the word "public," and inserting the word 'private,' in both places, so that the reference in the same shall be to chapter three hundred and ninety-eight of the private laws of eighteen hundred and sixty-four, instead of, to chapter three hundred and ninety-eight of the public laws of eighteen hundred and sixty-four.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Approved February 27, 1873.
