Chapter 104.CHAP. 104.

Resolve in favor of the city of Hallowell.

Resolved, That there be paid from the state treasury, to the city of Hallowell, the sum of one hundred ninety dollars and sixty-six cents, the same being for correction of a clerical error made in the apportionment of the school fund and mill tax fund to said city of Hallowell, and that the state treasurer be directed to deduct the above sum of one hundred ninety dollars and sixty-six cents from the school fund before making the apportionment for the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three.

Chapter 105.

Resolve in favor of Charles O. Higgins.

Resolved, That the land agent be and he hereby is authorized to convey Charles O. Higgins the lot of land number four, section sixty-nine, in the plantation of Mapleton, in the county of Aroostook, at the usual price paid for settling lands without the performance of other settling duties.

Chapter 106.

Resolve in aid of building a road in township F, range one, in the county of Aroostook.

Resolved, That the sum of five hundred dollars be, and the same is hereby appropriated to be expended under the direction of the land agent, in aid of building a road in township F, range one, in the county of Aroostook.

Chapter 107.

Resolve in favor of Peter Sepsis.

Resolved, That there be paid from the state treasury the sum of one hundred dollars to Peter Sepsis for travel and attendance before the legislature, as representative of the Passamaquoddy tribe of Indians.
