**CHAP. 108.****Chapter 108.**

Resolve in favor of Charles O. Donham.

Charles O. Donham, in favor of.

*Resolved*, That the land agent be and he is hereby authorized and directed to convey by deed to Charles O. Donham lot numbered thirteen in township number four, range four, west from the east line of the state, in the county of Aroostook, waiving further settling duties.

Approved February 4, 1873.

**Chapter 109.**

Resolve in favor of Samuel Harvey.

Samuel Harvey, in favor of.

*Resolved*, That the land agent be and he is hereby authorized to deed to Samuel Harvey of Mount Chase, in the county of Penobscot, lot numbered seventy-five in the town of Mount Chase, whenever said lot is paid for in road labor, waiving further settling duties.

Approved February 4, 1873.

**Chapter 110.**

Resolve in favor of Charles A. Chase.

Charles A. Chase, in favor of.

*Resolved*, That there be paid from the state treasury to Charles A. Chase of township number six of Aroostook county, the sum of three hundred and fifteen dollars and twenty cents for timber cut on his land, lot number forty-seven, township number six, range five, west from the east line of the state, in Aroostook county, in the year eighteen hundred and sixty-nine, the stumpage of which was paid to the state.

Approved February 4, 1873.

**Chapter 111.**

Resolve in favor of John Gabriel.

John Gabriel, in favor of.

*Resolved*, That there be paid from the state treasury the sum of twenty-five dollars to John Gabriel of the Passamaquoddy tribe of Indians, for travel and attendance before the legislature, as contestant.

Approved February 4, 1873.
