**CHAP. 116.** from the town of Sherman to Houlton, which lies in Crystal plantation; the same to be expended under the direction of the land agent or some person by him designated.

Approved February 11, 1873.

### Chapter 116.

Resolve in favor of the Bangor Children's Home.

Bangor Children's Home, in favor of.

*Resolved,* That there be paid out of any moneys not otherwise appropriated, the sum of one thousand dollars to the trustees of the Bangor Children's Home, and the governor is hereby authorized to draw his warrant on the treasury therefor.

Approved February 11, 1873.

### Chapter 117.

Resolve in favor of Charles S. Page.

Charles S. Page, in favor of.

*Resolved,* That the governor and council pay to the Perkins institution and Massachusetts asylum for the blind, of South Boston, Massachusetts, a sum not exceeding three hundred dollars for the support of Charles S. Page of Winterport, a partially blind person, for the ensuing year, to enable him to learn a trade, by which he may support himself, out of the state treasury, from funds appropriated for the deaf, dumb and blind.

Approved February 11, 1873.

### Chapter 118.

Resolve in aid of repairing the road through Long Swamp, in the town of Littleton.

Long Swamp road, in favor of.

*Resolved,* That there be an appropriation from the state, to be expended under the direction of the land agent, or by some one by him appointed, on the road through Long swamp, so called, in the town of Littleton, in the county of Aroostook, the sum of one thousand dollars.
