CHAP. 129.**Chapter 129.**

Resolve in addition to chapter one hundred and three of the resolves of eighteen hundred and sixty-seven, relating to Indian affairs.

Penobscot Indians, election of officers.

Resolved, That chapter one hundred and three of the resolves of eighteen hundred and sixty-seven be amended in the third and fourth lines, by striking out "second Tuesday of September" and inserting 'first Wednesday in November.'

Approved February 17, 1873.

Chapter 130.

Resolves providing for surveying and marking the line between Maine and New Hampshire.

State line between Maine and New Hampshire, to establish.

Resolved, That the land agent be authorized to appoint a surveyor on the part of Maine, who shall have power under his direction, and in conjunction with a surveyor to be appointed on the part of New Hampshire, to ascertain, survey and mark the dividing line, or parts thereof, as may be found necessary between this state and New Hampshire, and that the expense of said survey be paid out of any moneys in the treasury, not otherwise appropriated under the direction of the governor and council.

Resolved, That the governor of this state be requested to transmit a copy of the foregoing resolve to the governor of the state of New Hampshire, and to request the coöperation of that state in surveying said line.

Chapter 131.

Resolve relating to newspaper postage.

Newspaper postage, relating to.

Resolved, That our senators and representatives in congress be requested to oppose the passage of any law requiring the prepayment of newspaper postage at the office of publication as unjust to the newspapers of Maine and of other parts of the Union outside of the great commercial centres, and as injuriously affecting the interests of this state.
