**Chapter 132.**

**CHAP. 132.**

Resolve in favor of Joseph Gary.

*Resolved*, That the land agent be, and he hereby is authorized to convey to Joseph Gary, in the town of Lyndon and county of Aroostook, a lot of land, number one hundred and one, without obliging said Gary to erect a house thereon, providing he performs all other settling duties.

**Chapter 133.**

Resolve in favor John Gabriel.

*Resolved*, That there be paid from the state treasury the sum of thirty-two dollars, to John Gabriel, for house furnished and labor for the prevention of the spread of the small pox in the Passamaquoddy tribe of Indians in the winter of eighteen hundred and seventy-two.

John Gabriel, in favor of.

**Chapter 134.**

Resolve in favor of the joint standing committee on the state prison.

*Resolved*, That the state treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to pay to Henry H. Burgess, the sum of one hundred and five dollars and fifty cents, it being for expenses incurred by the committee visiting the state prison, the twentieth day of January, eighteen hundred and seventy-three.

**Chapter 135.**

Resolve providing for the payment of the expenses of the committee on military affairs.

*Resolved*, That there be paid from the treasury, to William E. Hadlock, for the committee on military affairs, the sum of fifty dollars, the same being for expenses incurred by that committee in visiting the Military and Naval Orphan Asylum at Bath, in compliance with an order of the legislature.
