Chapter 143.

Resolve in favor of Annie O. Burnham.

A. O. Burnham, in favor of. Resolved, That a pension of eight dollars per month, commencing the first day of January, in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and seventy-three, and continuing during the pleasure of the legislature, to be paid out of money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, be granted to Annie O. Burnham, whose only son, A. S. Burnham, died in the service of the United States, in company H, thirty-first regiment Maine volunteers.

Approved February 19, 1873.

Chapter 144.

Resolve in favor of Moses A. Currier.

Moses A. Currier, in favor of Resolved, That the land agent be and is hereby authorized to deed to Moses A. Currier lot numbered twenty-five, in township number nine, range six, in the county of Aroostook, waiving further settling duties.

Approved February 19, 1873.

Chapter 145.

Resolve in favor of appropriating money for the repair of the bridge across the Mattawamkeag river, in the plantation of Haynesville.

Bridge across Mattawamkeag river, in favor of. Resolved, That the sum of three hundred and fifty dollars be, and the same is hereby appropriated for the repair of bridge across the Mattawamkeag river at Haynesville, in county of Aroostook, to be expended under the direction of the land agent.

Approved February 21, 1873.

Chapter 146.

Resolve establishing the valuation of the estates of the several towns of Sagadahoe county.

Towns of Sagadahoc county, establishing valuation of. Resolved, That the valuation of the estates of the several towns and cities in the county of Sagadahoc be as follows: Arrowsic, one hundred three thousand ninety-three dollars; Bath, six millions four hundred two thousand seven hundred thirteen dollars;

Bowdoin, four hundred six thousand five hundred fifty dollars; Chap. 147. Bowdoinham, six hundred forty-six thousand four hundred twentytwo dollars; Georgetown, one hundred sixty-eight thousand five hundred dollars; Perkins, thirty-six thousand seven hundred ninety-two dollars; Phipsburg, four hundred twenty-seven thousand three hundred three dollars; Richmond, one million two hundred forty-two thousand forty dollars; Topsham, eight hundred eighty thousand two hundred sixty-five dollars; West Bath, one hundred thirty thousand twelve dollars; Woolwich, five hundred ninety-seven thousand six hundred fifty dollars; and that the state and county taxes for the year eighteen hundred and seventy-three and thereafter shall be based upon said sums respectively.

Chapter 147.

Resolve in favor of W. J. Corthell.

Resolved, That the sum of ninety-seven dollars and fifty cents w. J. Corthell, be and the same is hereby appropriated to be paid to W. J. Corthell, the same being the amount paid by him for the expense of the committee on education, in visiting and examining the Western State Normal School at Farmington, in accordance with a vote of the legislature.

Chapter 148.

Resolve in favor of the Military and Naval Asylum at Bath.

Resolved, That there be and hereby is appropriated the sum of Military and ten thousand dollars for the benefit of the Military and Naval Asylum at Bath, in favor of. Asylum at Bath, the same to be expended under the direction of the governor and council.

Resolves in favor of the state prison.

Resolved, That the sum of five thousand dollars for the purchase State prison, in of a steam fire engine and sufficient hose for the use of the state
