CHAP. 197.**Chapter 197.**

Resolve in favor of the town of Poland.

Town of Poland,
in favor of.

Resolved, That there be paid from the state treasury to the town of Poland the sum of two hundred and four dollars and forty-two cents, the same being for correction of a clerical error made in the return of scholars for said town of Poland, and that the state treasurer be directed to deduct the above sum of two hundred and four dollars and forty-two cents from the school fund before making the apportionment for the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three.

Chapter 198.

Resolve in favor of James Walton.

James Walton,
in favor of.

Resolved, That the land agent be and hereby is authorized to convey to James Walton, lot number twenty-two, containing thirty-eight acres, and lot number twenty-three, containing forty-two and one-fourth acres in that part of Lyndon formerly Eaton Grant, upon satisfactory evidence that the settling duties are performed in full excepting building and residing upon one of said lots, and that they are paid for to the state, and that there is no other claimant of either of said lots.

Chapter 199.

Resolve in favor of J. W. Hines.

J. W. Hines, in
favor of.

Resolved, That the land agent is hereby instructed to deed to J. W. Hines, a lot of one hundred and sixty acres of the state land not otherwise deeded, in lieu of a certain lot number one hundred and twenty-nine, township number twelve, range four, said described lot of land being the same that was deeded to the widow of the late H. B. Elliot by an act of the legislature of eighteen hundred and sixty-eight, to which said Hines was entitled and under this resolve shall be in full consideration of said Hines' claim against the state by reason of said Elliot.
