Chapter 541.

An act respecting the Edward Little Institute.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Authorized to apply means to support high school in Auburn.

SECT. 1. The Edward Little Institute, a corporation established according to the terms of its charter, for the purpose of advancing science and literature, and promoting morality, piety and religion, is authorized to appropriate and apply such portion of its means for the support of the high school in Auburn, to be known as the Edward Little High School, and such portion to such other literary institution in the state as the trustees shall find will best and most effectually carry out the expressed objects of said charter.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 542.

An act to incorporate the Milo Cheese Manufacturing Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Corporators.

SECT. 1. J. H. Macomber, Phineas Tolman, James L. Bishop, Robert Wells, Ephraim Severance, E. B. Tolman, Uriah B. Stubbs, N. W. Sargent, I. W. Hanscom, S. S. Sturtevant, Isaac S. Leonard, their associates, successors and assigns, are hereby created a body

Corporate name.

politic and corporate by the name of the Milo Cheese Manufacturing Company, with all the powers and privileges and subject to all the duties and liabilities provided by the laws of this state concerning manufacturing corporations.

Authorized to manufacture cheese.

SECT. 2. Said corporation is authorized to manufacture cheese and to transact any other business usually carried on by cheese manufacturing corporations for the purposes of associated dairying. The capital stock of said corporation shall not exceed the

Capital stock and shares.

sum of three thousand dollars, to be divided into such number of shares as the company may determine ; and said corporation may hold real and personal estate to the amount of said capital stock, with full power to manage and dispose of the same.

May hold real and personal estate.

First meeting, how called.

SECT. 3. The first meeting of said corporation shall be held in Milo, and shall be called by a notice thereof, seven days prior to said meeting, signed by two or more persons named in the first section of this act, a copy of which shall be given to each of the corporators.

SECT. 4. This act shall take effect when approved.
