## Chapter 51.

## CHAP. 51.

An act to incorporate the North Wales Slate Company.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

SECT. 1. William G. Jones, Eben F. Pillsbury, Lucien B. Pillsbury, I. Clifford Belcher and Jeremiah Belcher, their associates, successors and assigns, are hereby created a body politic and corporate by the name of the North Wales Slate Company, for the purpose of quarrying, manufacturing and selling slate in its various forms, with all the powers and privileges, and subject to all the duties and liabilities and requirements of similar corporations under the laws of this state.

Corporators.

Corporate name.

Powers, privileges and liabilities.

SECT. 2. Said corporation may hold real and personal estate to an amount not exceeding at any time the sum of two hundred and fifty thousand dollars, with full powers to manage and dispose of the same.

May hold real and personal estate.

SECT. 3. Said corporation may divide their original stock into such number of shares, and provide for the sale and transfer of the same, in such manner and form as said corporation shall from time to time determine, not repugnant to the laws of this state.

Stock and shares.

SECT. 4. Any two of the persons named in the first section of this act may call the first meeting of said company, at Farmington, by giving to each of the other persons named therein a written notice of the time and place of holding said meeting, at least seven days before holding the same ; and a majority of the corporators named in this act, being present at any meeting, are hereby authorized to legally organize under this act.

First meeting, how called.

Authorized to organize.

SECT. 5. This act shall take effect when approved.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

SECT. 1. Edward Partridge, Otis Harriman, Frank S. Harriman, Richard M. Trescott, George W. Crockett, J. M. Grant, Louis Mudget, Adelbert Crockett, and Nelson P. Staples, their associates, successors and assigns, are hereby created a body politic and corporate by the name of the Prospect and Stockton Cheese Company, with all the powers and privileges, and subject to all
