PRIVATE AND SPECIAL LAWS

OF THE

SECT. 3. If said corporation shall elect so to do, it may reduce the par value of the shares of its present stock to such sum as it may determine, in the manner provided in the first section hereof, instead of reducing the number of shares as provided in said section, and may issue the new shares at the same par value, in the manner provided in the second section hereof, and said old and new shares shall in all respects be equal.

CHAP. 61.

Shares, par value of, may be reduced.

SECT. 4. This act shall take effect whenever the same shall be accepted by the stockholders in said corporation, at a legal meeting thereof, called and held for that purpose, within one year from the passage of this act.

Chapter 61.

An act to make valid the doings of the town of Amity.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. The acts and doings of the town of Amity at the annual town meeting holden on the thirtieth day of March, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, and all assessments made by the assessors of said town during said year are hereby made valid.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 62.

An act authorizing the inhabitants of the town of Eastport to vote aid towards building a railroad from tide waters within said town, to connect with any shore line railroad.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. The inhabitants of the town of Eastport are hereby authorized, at their annual town meeting, or at any meeting duly called therefor, to vote aid of said town for the purpose of building a railroad from tide waters in said town, to connect with any shore line railroad constructed between the Penobscot and Saint Croix rivers, to an amount not exceeding ten per centum of its state valuation; *provided*, that said vote shall be by two-thirds
