CHAP. 66.

Chapter 66.

An act to legalize the doings of School District number four in the town of Lamoine.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

School Dist. No. 4,
Lamoine, to
legalize doings of.

SECT. 1. The doings of School District number four, in the town of Lamoine, in the county of Hancock, at school district meetings held from March first to October first, eighteen hundred and seventy-four, in raising money, assessing and collecting taxes for the purpose of building a school-house, are hereby made legal.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 67.

An act to authorize Mellen Gilmore and Luther V. Gilmore to build wharves and piers.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Authorized to
build wharves
and piers.

SECT. 1. Mellen Gilmore and Luther V. Gilmore and their associates, successors or assigns, are hereby authorized to build wharves and piers on their own land, in the towns of Eddington and Brewer; said wharves and piers are not to extend into the Penobscot river further than low water mark, and not to interfere in any way or obstruct the navigation, driving logs or running rafts or boats down said river.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 68.

An act to incorporate the Mattawamkeag Boat Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Corporators.

SECT. 1. Fayette Shaw, Brackley Shaw and William Shaw, their associates, successors and assigns, are hereby created a corporation by the name of the Mattawamkeag Boat Company, with all the powers and privileges of similar corporations, and subject to the conditions and liabilities set forth in chapter seventy-six of the revised statutes, for the purpose of improving the navigation of the Mattawamkeag river and branches, in Penobscot and Aroostook counties.
