Chapter 100.**CHAP. 100.**

An act to authorize the Cobb Lime Company to increase its capital stock.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. The Cobb Lime Company, incorporated by general law, is hereby authorized to increase its capital stock to a sum not exceeding eight hundred thousand dollars, which shall be determined at any legal meeting of the stockholders of the company, called for that purpose; and such increase shall be made by an issue of additional shares, of the par value of one hundred dollars each.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 101.

An act to incorporate Mystic Tie Lodge Knights of Pythias, of Saco.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. That John W. Sweetser, John A. Tucker, Nathaniel T. Boothby, Charles E. Usher, Bradford W. Blaisdell, Charles W. Ross, George W. Hall, Albion W. Larrabee, Henry King, Charles H. Hanson, Enoch Jordan, jr., Leander A. Foss, James Higgins, Daniel E. Johnson, John Lord, and all others who are at the present time members of Mystic Tie Lodge, Number Seven, Knights of Pythias, of Saco, Maine, and all persons who may hereafter become members thereof, shall be and they are hereby declared to be a body politic and corporate by the name, style and title of Mystic Tie Lodge, Number Seven, Knights of Pythias, of Saco, Maine, to have perpetual succession, to sue and be sued, to plead and be impleaded in all courts of record and elsewhere, to have and use a common seal, to take, hold and enjoy property, personal and real, to them and their successors, and generally to do all other acts and enjoy all other powers and privileges incident to similar corporations under the laws of this state; *provided*, that the net yearly income of the property held by them shall not exceed the sum of three thousand dollars.

SECT. 2. Said order being an organization established for benevolent and charitable purposes, such shall be its great aim and primary object, and said corporation shall have power to do and perform all acts in accordance with the constitution and by-laws of said corporation as may be deemed necessary for the well being and management of its affairs.
