Sect. 2. Said corporation may purchase and hold real and per- Chap. 103. sonal property to an amount not exceeding at any one time two hundred thousand dollars, with full power to manage and dispose of the same.

and hold real and personal

The first meeting of said corporation may be called First meeting, SECT. 3. by either of the persons named in the first section of this act, by giving notice in writing to the other corporators, seven days at least before said meeting, of the time and place and the purposes for which said meeting is called.

This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 103.

An act to incorporate the Little Blue Slate Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Sect. 1. Alexander H. Abbott, S. Clifford Belcher, Frances I. Corporators. , Abbott and Ella O. Belcher, their associates, successors and assigns, are hereby created a body politic and corporate by the name of Little Blue Slate Company, for the purpose of quarrying, Corporate name. manufacturing, buying and selling slate in its various forms, with all the powers and privileges and subject to all the duties, liabilities and requirements of similar corporations by the laws of this state.

Sect. 2. Said corporation may purchase and hold real and May purchase and hold real and hold real and personal estate to an amount not exceeding at any one time two personal estate. hundred and fifty thousand dollars, with full powers to manage and dispose of the same.

SECT. 3. Said corporation may divide their original stock into Shares. such number of shares and provide for the sale and transfer thereof, in such manner and form as said corporation shall from time to time determine, not repugnant to the laws of this state.

Alexander H. Abbott is hereby authorized to call the First meeeting, first meeting of said corporation, by giving to each person named in this act a written notice of the time and place of holding such meeting, seven days before holding the same; and a majority of the corporators named in this act, being present at any meeting, are hereby authorized to legally organize under this act.

This act shall take effect when approved.
