CHAP. 104.

Chapter 104.

An act to incorporate the Wood and Bishop Foundry Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Corporators.	SECT. 1. Henry A. Wood, William H. Bishop, John F. Colby and Charles H. Wood, their associates, successors and assigns, are hereby constituted and created a body politic and corporate,
Corporate name.	by the name of the Wood and Bishop Foundry Company, with authority to manufacture, buy and sell merchandise, tools, implements and machinery of wood, iron and other materials, with all the privileges and subject to all the liabilities pertaining to corporations in this state.
Privileges and liabilities.	
Authorized to purchase and hold real and personal estate.	SECT. 2. Said corporation is authorized to purchase and hold real and personal estate to the amount of two hundred thousand dollars ; to have a common seal, with the right to make all needful by-laws for the government of said corporation not inconsistent with the laws of this state.
Capital stock.	SECT. 3. The capital stock of said corporation shall be divided into not more than two thousand shares, of the par value of one hundred dollars each.

Chapter 105.

An act to incorporate the Monson Pearl Slate Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Corporators.	SECT. 1. William Lane, A. T. Wade, Charles A. Everett, A. M. Robinson and James Foss, their associates, successors and assigns, are hereby created a body politic and corporate by the name of Monson Pearl Slate Company, in the town of Monson, county of Piscataquis, for the purpose of quarrying and manufacturing slate in its various forms, and for any purpose in which slate rock can be used, with all the powers and privileges, and subject to all the duties, liabilities and requirements of similar corporations by the laws of the state.

May construct a tramway, &c.	SECT. 2. Said company shall have the right to construct and maintain a tramway, railroad and bridges from their works to the Piscataquis branch of the European and North American Railroad, for the purposes of transportation to and from their quarry. The company may purchase and hold real estate necessary for the track of said railroad, and may cross the highway in the same

manner as other railroads, and may also purchase and hold real and personal estate not exceeding two hundred and fifty thousand dollars at any one time, with full power to manage and dispose of the same.

CHAP. 106.

SECT. 3. The shares of said company shall be of such number as the directors may determine, the par value of which shall not exceed two hundred and fifty thousand dollars.

Shares.

SECT. 4. William Lane is hereby authorized to call the first meeting of said corporation, at Abbot, by giving to each person named in this act a written notice of the time and place of holding such meeting seven days before holding the same; and a majority of the corporators named in this act being present at any meeting are hereby authorized to legally organize under this act.

SECT. 5. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 106.

An act to incorporate the Cedar Brook and Swift Cambridge River Improvement Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. Albert L. Burbank, Gilman Chapman and David Hammons, their associates, successors and assigns, are hereby created a body politic and corporate by the name of the Cedar Brook and Swift Cambridge River Improvement Company, with all the powers and privileges of similar corporations.

SECT. 2. Said corporation may construct as many dams, side dams, and sluices for the purpose of holding water on Cedar brook and that part of Swift Cambridge river, situate in the town of Grafton, in the county of Oxford, as they may deem necessary for the purpose of floating or driving logs down said streams to lake Umbagog, and also to remove all stones, trees and other obstructions from the beds thereof, and said corporation may take land and materials for the purpose of locating and constructing said dams, and making other improvements, being accountable to the owners thereof for all damages, if any, to be ascertained by reference or by action upon the case.

SECT. 3. The said corporation may demand and receive as a toll for all logs that may be driven or float down said streams into the town of Upton, in said Oxford county, the sum of three cents per log, and a lien is hereby created upon said logs, to continue for
