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An act to incorporate the Topsham and Brunswick Twenty-Five Cent Savings Bank.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

Corporators.	SECT. 1. Wildes P. Walker, William Scholfield, Theodore McLellan, W. B. Purinton, Daniel Elliot, Henry C. Martin, George Barron, Charles E. White, Edmund D. Toothaker, A. W. Curtis, L. H. Stover, Daniel H. Stone, P. C. Merryman and Robert P. Whitney, their associates, successors and assigns, are hereby constituted a body politic and corporate by the name of

Seal.	to have and use a common seal, to make all such by-laws, rules

Location.	state. Said corporation shall be established in the town of Brunswick, and shall be subject to all the duties and liabilities, and

Deposits.	SECT. 2. The said corporation is hereby authorized to receive deposits of money, deeds of conveyance, assignments of choses in
Income.	action and bills of sale of property, to issue certificates of such cash deposits, and such deposits of money shall be used as they
First meeting, how called.	shall judge most for the benefit of said corporation; and such deposits may be withdrawn at such reasonable times and in such manner as a majority of the corporators named in this act shall
Members.	appoint, and the net income or profit thereof shall be divided by them among the persons making such deposits, their executors, administrators or assigns, in just proportion.
Officers.	SECT. 3. Wildes P. Walker, named herein, is authorized to call the first meeting of said corporation, by giving seven days' notice, in writing, to each of the other corporators; and his affidavit of
Treasurer and secretary shall be sworn.	having given such notice, sworn to before any justice of the peace in said Brunswick or Topsham, shall be conclusive evidence of the fact, at which meeting, and at every subsequent annual meeting, said corporation may by ballot choose any person or persons as
Treasurer shall give bond.	members thereof, may choose such officers as to them may seem necessary, who shall continue in office one year, and until others are chosen in their places. The treasurer and secretary elect, before entering upon their official duties, shall be sworn to the faithful performance thereof, and the treasurer shall further give
Proviso.	satisfactory bond, to be approved by the corporation, for the faithful discharge of his duties, and with such other conditions as the corporation may require; <i>provided, however,</i> that the offices of secretary and treasurer may be united in one person.

SECT. 4. All deeds of conveyance, covenants and grants, made in behalf of said corporation, shall be sealed with the corporate seal, and when made in pursuance of any vote of the corporation, shall be valid and binding on the corporation.

SECT. 5. The annual meeting shall be holden at said Brunswick, in the month of January, and at that meeting and all other meetings, it shall require at least seven of the corporators or their associates to constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

Chapter 110.

An act repealing "an act to prevent the taking of pickerel in Three Mile pond, in the towns of Vassalboro', China and Windsor."

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

SECT. 1. The act entitled "an act to prevent the taking of pickerel in Three Mile pond in the towns of Vassalboro', China and Windsor," approved March fifth, eighteen hundred and sixty-nine, is hereby repealed.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 111.

An act to legalize the doings of school district number three, in the town of St. George, in the county of Knox.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

SECT. 1. The doings of school district number three, in the town of St. George, in the county of Knox, at the meetings of the legal voters thereof, held on the twenty-second and twenty-fifth days of July, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, are hereby confirmed and made valid.
