Chapter 122.

CHAP. 122.

An act to incorporate the Washington County Masonic Relief Association.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. N. B. Nutt, Warren Hathaway, T. M. Bibber, W. J. Fisher, R. B. Clark, W. D. Aymar, G. K. Hatch, I. N. Whitman, J. M. Hawkes, John Mincher, Thomas Abraham, Joseph Wilder, jr., Daniel Laughton, Andrew Gilson, H. R. Taylor, F. L. Talbot, D. E. Seymour, D. M. Gardner, James L. Thompson, John Campbell, their associates, successors and assigns, are hereby made and constituted a body politic and corporate by the name of the Washington County Masonic Relief Association, for the purpose of providing relief to such members of the association as may from time to time need assistance, and to the families of deceased members of the association who may be entitled to aid under the rules and by-laws which may be adopted for the government of said organization.

Corporators.

Corporate name.

SECT. 2. Said association shall have a common seal, power to prosecute and defend suits at law, to make any by-laws for the management of their affairs not repugnant to the laws of this state, to take and hold, sell and convey real and personal property to the value of thirty thousand dollars, and have all the privileges usually granted to other corporations for similar purposes.

May hold and convey real and personal property

SECT. 3. N. B. Nutt, G. K. Hatch, F. L. Talbot and D. M. Gardner may call the first meeting of said association, at such time and place as they may direct, by giving reasonable written notice to their associates.

First meeting, how called.

SECT. 4. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 123.

An act to extend the time for the location and completion of the Penobscot Bay and River Railroad.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. The Penobscot Bay and River Railroad Company may have a further time of five years from and after the time fixed in the act incorporating said company, for locating and filing the location of their railroad; and also a further time of five years from and after the time fixed in said act, for the building and completion of the said railroad, and all the powers and privileges

Time for locating road extended.

—building and completing extended.

CHAP. 124. granted to said company shall continue and be in force during said term of extension of time.

Proviso.

SECT. 2. Provided that said company shall not construct any bridge across the Belfast bay or harbor at any point below Lane's wharf, so called.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 124.

An act to incorporate the Cumberland Fish Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Corporators.

SECT. 1. Hezekiah Winslow, Mark P. Emery, James M. Kimball, their associates and successors, are hereby made a corporation by the name of the Cumberland Fish Company, for the purpose of breeding and cultivating fish, with all the powers and privileges and subject to the duties, restrictions and liabilities set forth in the forty-sixth chapter of the revised statutes, and in all the general laws which now are or hereafter may be in force, relating to such corporations.

Corporate name.

Capital stock.

SECT. 2. The capital stock of said corporation shall be not exceeding twenty thousand dollars.

May purchase and hold real estate.

SECT. 3. The said corporation shall be entitled to purchase and hold real estate not exceeding in value ten thousand dollars, and personal property not exceeding in value ten thousand dollars.

Exclusive rights not conferred.

SECT. 4. This act shall not be construed to confer upon said corporation any exclusive rights or privileges in any of the waters of the state.

SECT. 5. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 125.

An act additional to "an act establishing the Portland and Rochester Railroad Company."

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :
