CHAP. 136.Jurisdiction of
trial justices.

SECT. 12. Trial justices are hereby restricted from exercising any jurisdiction in the city of Auburn over any matter or thing, civil or criminal, except such as are within the jurisdiction of justices of the peace and of the quorum, and except that they may issue warrants on complaints for criminal offences, to be returned before said municipal court; *provided* that said restrictions shall be suspended until the judge of said court shall enter upon the duties of his office.

Proviso.

SECT. 13. This act shall take effect on the eighth day of March next after it is approved.

Chapter 136.

An act to authorize William Conary to extend and maintain a wharf into tide waters at Bluehill.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Authorized to
extend wharf.

SECT. 1. William Conary, his heirs and assigns, are hereby authorized and empowered to extend and maintain a wharf into tide waters at Bluehill, in front of his own land.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 137.

An act to incorporate the Wayne Cheese Factory Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. P. F. Pike, G. M. True, William H. Roberts, Silas A. Manter, William H. Burgess, Luther S. Maxim, Henry A. Dexter, Edward G. Dexter, Willard M. Besse, Charles R. Besse, Hiram N. Jennings, Tudor Jennings, S. T. Bishop, James M. Wing, H. A. Lowell, L. C. Leadbetter, A. D. Wing, Josiah Norris, John M. Gott, Sewell Pettengill, J. S. Perry, Freeman Manter, Obed Wing, Alfred Johnson, J. C. Stinchfield, S. W. Bishop, William G. Pease, H. J. Ridley, Richard Berry and H. H. Pulsifer, their associates and successors, are hereby constituted a corporation by the name of the Wayne Cheese Factory Company.

Corporate name.

- SECT. 2. This association may have a capital stock not exceeding three thousand dollars, to be divided into such number of shares as they may decide; may hold real and personal estate to that amount; may make such rules and regulations as are necessary for the management of their affairs; and shall hold and exercise all the powers and privileges usually granted companies for the purpose of engaging in associated dairying.
- SECT. 3. The first meeting of said corporation shall be held in Wayne, and called by P. F. Pike, by giving seven days' notice thereof.
- SECT. 4. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 138.

An act relating to the city schools of Bangor.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- SECT. 1. The superintending school committee of the city of Bangor shall consist of seven members, to be elected by the city council.
- SECT. 2. The city council may provide that a part of said members shall hold for one year, a part for two years, and a part for three years, in the first instance; and in case they shall so provide, shall annually supply the vacancy that exists in the board; in case they shall not so provide, the tenure of office of the whole board shall be for one year, and until others are qualified in their stead.
- SECT. 3. The city council may annually elect an agent, whose duties shall be prescribed by the superintending school committee.
- SECT. 4. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 139.

An act to incorporate the Olamon Dam Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- SECT. 1. Josiah Towle, Josiah C. Towle, Samuel Taylor, their associates, successors or assigns, are hereby created a body politic and corporate by the name of the Olamon Dam Company.
