PRIVATE AND SPECIAL LAWS

OF THE

relating to abating a portion of the state tax of Waterville for the Chap. 141. year eighteen hundred and seventy-three, and assessing the same upon the town of West Waterville, is hereby amended by inserting after the words "West Waterville," in the sixth line, the words 'for the year eighteen hundred and seventy-five,' and striking out the word "January," in said section two, and inserting the word 'July,' so that said section as amended shall read as follows:

'SECT. 2. The treasurer of state is hereby authorized and Warrant for directed to send his warrant, directed to the assessors of West Waterville, in said county of Kennebec, requiring them to assess the said sum of two thousand eight hundred fifty-eight dollars and seventy-two cents, upon the polls and estates of said town of West Waterville, for the year eighteen hundred and seventy-five, and requiring the same to be collected and paid into the state treasury on or before the first day of July next, being for three-tenths of the state tax of Waterville, for the year eighteen hundred and seventy-three, chargeable to the town of West Waterville by an act approved February twenty-sixth, eighteen hundred and seventy-three, entitled "an act to incorporate the town of West Waterville.",

Chapter 141.

An act to incorporate the Trustees of the Saint Augustine School for Boys at Topsham.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Sect. I. O. L. Billings, Warren Johnson, W. B. Purinton, Corporators. Wilds P. Walker, Henry A. Neely, Fred S. Sill, Ira Merriman, C. J. Gilman and George E. B. Jackson, their associates and successors, are hereby incorporated a body politic by the name of the Trustees of the Saint Augustine School for Boys, at Tops- Corporate name. ham, Maine, for the promotion of literature, science and morality.

Sect. 2. Said corporation is hereby vested with all the rights, privileges and immunities incident to similar corporations; may use a common seal, prosecute and defend suits at law, make and seal. establish by-laws and regulations for the management of its affairs By-laws. and the ordering of said school, not repugnant to the laws of this state, and hold estate, real and personal, that it may receive by May hold real gift, grant or otherwise, the yearly net income of which shall not estate. exceed the sum of five thousand dollars.

Sect. 3. O. L. Billings is hereby authorized to call the first meeting of said corporation, by posting up notices in two or more public places in Topsham, ten days at least before the meeting of said corporation.

Sect. 4. This act shall take effect approved.

Chapter 142.

An act to incorporate the Canton and Dixfield Cheese Factory.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Corporators.

Sect. 1. John W. Howe, Sewall Dunn, Adelbert Delano, D. M. Foster, A. R. Foster, and Granville Child, their associates and successors, are hereby constituted a corporation by the name of the Canton and Dixfield Cheese Factory.

Corporate name.

Capital stock and shares.

May hold real and personal estate.

Rules and regulations.

First meeting, where held and how called. the Canton and Dixfield Cheese Factory.

Sect 2. This association may have a capital stock not exceeding three thousand dollars, to be divided into such number of shares as they may decide; may hold real and personal estate to that amount; may make such rules and regulations as are necessary for the management of their affairs, and shall hold and exercise

Sect. 3. The first meeting of said corporation shall be held in Canton, and called by John W. Howe, by giving seven days' notice in writing to the other incorporators thereof.

Sect. 4. This act shall take effect when approved.
