shall be divided among the persons making such deposits, their executors, administrators or assigns, in just proportion, after deducting the necessary expense of carrying on the affairs of the corporation. CHAP. 150.

SECT. 3. Said corporation may purchase and hold real and personal estate, with full power to manage and dispose of the same. May hold real and personal estate.

SECT. 4. Any one of the persons named in the first section of this act may call the first meeting of said corporation, by giving seven days' notice thereof, in writing, to each of the corporators. First meeting, how called.

SECT. 5. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 150.

An act to incorporate the Maine Mining Company, of Portland.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. Lorenzo Taylor, George A. Mathews, James Willis Taylor and Albert F. Jackson, their associates, successors and assigns, are hereby incorporated by the name of the Maine Mining Company, for the purpose of operating mines in the State of Maine. Corporators.
Said company shall possess all the rights and privileges, and be subject to all the duties, liabilities and requirements of similar corporations, under the laws of this state. Corporate name.

SECT. 2. Said company may also purchase and hold real and personal estate not exceeding two hundred and fifty thousand dollars at any one time, with full power to manage and dispose of the same. Rights and privileges.
May purchase and hold real and personal estate.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 151.

An act to make valid the organization of the Brown Slate Quarry Company, and to change the number of shares and par value thereof, in the stock of said company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

The organization of the Brown Slate Quarry Company, made under the provisions of sections eighteen, nineteen and twenty of chapter forty-eight of the revised statutes, and recorded Company, organization of, made legal.

CHAP. 152. in the office of register of deeds in the county of Piscataquis, in volume one, page two of the records of certificate of the organizations of corporations, and filed in the office of secretary of state, June ninth, eighteen hundred and seventy-three, is hereby made legal; and said company is hereby authorized to fix the number of shares in its capital stock at four thousand, and the par value of each share at the sum of fifty dollars.

Chapter 152.

An act to prevent the taking of trout from Howard's pond, in the town of Hanover.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Taking of trout, forbidden.

SECT. 1. All persons are forbidden to take trout, in any manner, from Howard's pond, in the town of Hanover, county of Oxford, for the term of five years from the passage of this act.

Penalty for violation.

SECT. 2. If any person shall violate the provisions of this act, he shall forfeit and pay the sum of five dollars for each trout so taken, to be recovered by complaint before any trial justice, one-half to the use of complainant, and the other half to the use of said town of Hanover.

Chapter 153.

An act to prevent fishing in Otter pond in the town of Bridgton.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Fish, taking of, forbidden.

SECT. 1. All persons are forbidden to take fish of any description, in any manner, from Otter pond, in the town of Bridgton, county of Cumberland, for the term of five years from the passage of this act.

Penalty for violation.

SECT. 2. If any person shall violate the provisions of this act, he shall forfeit and pay the sum of five dollars for each fish so taken, to be recovered by complaint before any trial justice in said county of Cumberland, one-half to the use of complainant, and the other half to the use of said town of Bridgton.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.
