and declare them in open meeting and in the presence of the clerk, who shall make a list of the persons voted for, with the number of votes for each person against his name, and the offices respectively, and in open meeting and in the presence of the warden, shall make a fair record thereof; a fair copy of this list shall be attested by the warden and clerk, sealed up in open meeting and delivered to the selectmen of the said Vinalhaven, within twenty-four hours after closing the polls, and the votes thus thrown shall be deemed as thrown in and belonging to the said town of Vinalhaven.

CHAP. 177.

Clerk to make lists of votes.

—to deliver lists of votes to selectmen of Vinalhaven.

SECT. 6. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 177.

An act to authorize the county commissioners of Aroostook county to organize the Allagash plantation.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. The county commissioners of Aroostook county are hereby authorized and empowered to organize townships number sixteen, range ten, number sixteen, range eleven, number seventeen, range ten, and number seventeen, range eleven, into a plantation called Allagash plantation; said plantation to have the same powers, and be subject to the same liabilities as other plantations organized by the county commissioners.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 178.

An act to make valid the doings of school district number two, in the town of Monroe.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

The doings of school district number two in the town of Monroe, at school district meetings held by them in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, and all subsequent meetings to the present time; also the doings of all officers chosen at said meetings for the purpose of building a school-house in said district, and for raising money for said purpose, are hereby ratified and made legal.
