Joseph B. Clark and Edward R. Clark, prosecutors of George Sterritt, who was convicted at the last September term of said court of the larceny of a horse, harness and carriage, a fair compensation for their actual expenses, time and trouble in arresting said offender and securing the property stolen, the same as if said prosecutors had presented their claim therefor at the term when said offender was convicted.

Chapter 182.

An act to authorize the Lockwood Cotton Mills of Waterville, to change the name of its corporation,

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Sect. 1. The Lockwood Cotton Mills, a corporation established at Waterville, in the county of Kennebec, is hereby authorized to change its corporate name to the Lockwood Company.

Change of corporate name.

Sect. 2. If said corporation, by its trustees, shall vote to so change its name, the clerk of said corporation shall forthwith file a sworn certificate thereof in the office of the secretary of state.

Chapter 183.

An act to change the name of the First North Yarmouth Aqueduct Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. The First North Yarmouth Aqueduct Company, in Change of corpothe town of Yarmouth, and county of Cumberland, shall be hereafter known and called by the name of the First Yarmouth Aqueduct Company.

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
