CHAP. 190.**Chapter 190.**

An act to change the name of Helen M. Merrill.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Change of name.

SECT. 1. Helen M. Merrill, of Calais, shall be allowed to take the name of Helen M. Blyther.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 191.

An act to change the name of Frances Etta Felker.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Change of name.

That the name of Frances Etta Felker be changed to Etta Frances Brown.

Chapter 192.

An act to incorporate the town of Woodville.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Town of Woodville, to incorporate.

SECT. 1. Woodville plantation, composed of West Indian township, on the west side of Penobscot river, in the county of Penobscot, is hereby incorporated into a town by the name of Woodville, and the inhabitants of said town are hereby invested with all the powers, privileges, immunities and liabilities of other towns.

Meeting to choose officers.

SECT. 2. Any justice of the peace within the county of Penobscot, is hereby empowered to issue his warrant to some inhabitant of said town, directing him to notify the inhabitants thereof, to meet at such time and place as he shall appoint, to choose such officers as other towns are empowered to choose.

Town of Woodville to take property of plantation.
Taxes.

SECT. 3. The town hereby created shall take the property and effects belonging to Woodville plantation, and shall assume all the obligations thereof, and any collector of taxes for Woodville plantation is hereby empowered to collect any unpaid part of any commitment in his hands, and pay the same into the treasury of said town.

SECT. 4. This act shall take effect whenever a majority of the legal voters of said Woodville, at any legal meeting, shall so determine, and notice thereof be filed in the office of secretary of state.

CHAP. 193.

Act, when to take effect.

Approved February 24, 1875.

Chapter 193.

An act to provide for deficiency in the appropriations for the expenditures of government for the year eighteen hundred seventy-four.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. In order to provide for a deficiency in several appropriations for the year eighteen hundred seventy-four, the following sums are hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the treasury, and the governor, with the advice and consent of the council, is hereby authorized to draw his warrant on the treasury for the same :

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
