Chapter 13.

CHAP. 13.

Resolve in favor of Mitchell Paul Susup.

Resolved, That there be paid from the state treasury the sum of ninety dollars to Mitchell Paul Susup of the Penobscot tribe of Indians for travel and attendance before the legislature as delegate of said tribe.

Representative of Penobscot Indians, pay of.

Chapter 14.

Resolve apportioning to the town of Isle au Haut, in Hancock county, its proportional part of the state valuation of the town of Deer Isle, in said county.

Resolved, That the state valuation of the town of Isle au Haut, in the county of Hancock, be established as follows: number of taxable polls, forty-one; valuation of taxable estates, thirty thousand three hundred and fifty-six dollars; *and resolved further*, That said number of taxable polls, and said valuation of taxable estates be deducted from the present state valuation of the town of Deer Isle, in said county of Hancock.

State valuation of Isle au Haut and Deer Isle, established.

Chapter 15.

Resolve in favor of the county of Aroostook.

Resolved, That the sum of two hundred forty-two dollars be paid out of the state treasury to the treasurer of Aroostook county, being for moneys paid out by said treasurer for repairs made on roads through township number eight, range five, and L, range two in said county.

Chapter 16.

Resolve in favor of Thomas Ball and William P. Ball.

Resolved, That the land agent be and is hereby authorized to convey by deed to Thomas Ball and William P. Ball, lot numbered fifty-six in the town of Sherman, waiving further settling duties.
