Chapter 17.

Resolve in favor of Ether W. Sprague.

Resolved, That the land agent be, and he is hereby authorized to convey by deed to Ether W. Sprague lot numbered thirty-nine in the town of Easton, in the county of Aroostook, waiving further duties.

Chapter 18.

Resolve in favor of the town of Kingsbury.

Resolved, That the sum of five hundred dollars be, and the same is hereby appropriated to be expended under the direction of the land agent upon the New England road, so called, in the town of Kingsbury.

Chapter 19.

Resolve in favor of the county of Knox.

Knox county, in favor of. Resolved, That there be paid out of the state treasury, to the treasurer of the county of Knox, the sum of three thousand five hundred and ninety-four dollars and ninety-nine cents, it being the amount of costs and expenses incurred in the supreme judicial court in that county, at the September term, eighteen hundred and seventy-four, in the trial of Charles Tilton Robbins for the crime of murder.

Chapter 20.

Resolve in favor of Crystal plantation in county of Aroostook.

Crystal plantation, in favor of roads in. Resolved, That there be appropriated from the state treasury, to Crystal plantation, in the county of Aroostook, the sum of two thousand and five hundred dollars, under the following restrictions, limitations and conditions, viz: that if during the year eighteen hundred and seventy-five, the plantation of Crystal shall cut out and grub the Molunkus Valley road, as laid out by the commissioners of Aroostook county, through its whole length in
